

Jax Smith & Helene Taylor Are Pleased To Announce The Online Premiere Of Their Short Play 'DISCORd,' Part Of "Liminal Spaces: A Digital Play Trilogy" Streaming On October 8th In Support Of The CDA Institute Afghan Refugee Program





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Toronto, ON - October 4, 2021 - Where is the line? - Three short plays - MOTHER, MPDG, and DISCORd, will be digitally mounted by alma matters productions and MXL Live Loft. This co-production will be streamed via YouTube on Oct. 8th at 8 pm EST/5 pm PST. Tickets are available at Eventbrite on a Pay-What-You-Can system (\$15 minimum). 20% of all ticket sales will be donated to the CDA Institute Afghan Refugee Program, which helps to facilitate the arrival of Afghan Refugees into Canada. This theatrical trilogy explores the fringes of life and death, reality and fiction, and the boundaries of consent. Challenging these evolving structures, these plays give us pause to reflect and question: "Where is the line?"

This question is asked by the lead character Jane, in DISCORd, a prodigy pianist who becomes unhinged when she interviews with a sexually predatory music director, and is seemingly given her dream at the expense of her deceased mother's legacy.

DISCORd, the first play in the evening's lineup, is informed by writers Jax Smith and Helene Taylor's classical background in dance and music. Smith attended programs with schools like The Kirov Academy of Ballet and The American Ballet Theatre. Taylor came of age in the Royal Conservatory of Music.

In its original form, as a short-film script, DISCORd has garnered several laurels including: Top 25 Table Read My Screenplay Austin, Semi-Finalist Screencraft Film Fund, Semi-Finalist Script Short Screencraft, Short-list Filmmatic Film Festival, and was an official selection of the Cindependent Film Festival.

Smith and Taylor are now developing the material into a feature script, which dives further into the complexities of the muse/mentor relationship, the loneliness of musical genius, and the all-consuming intoxication of talent. "We're interested in that fine line between passion and destructive obsession," says Jax Smith. "Think Whiplash with sexual dynamics," adds Helene Taylor.

The short play was originally workshopped live in pre-pandemic Vancouver, with 50% of proceeds donated to the Movember Canada Foundation, in honor of Smith's late husband.

The alma matters and MXL Live Loft co-production on October 8th will be in support of the CDA Institute Afghan Refugee Program. 20% of all ticket sales will be donated to this organization, which helps to facilitate the arrival of Afghan Refugees into Canada.

DISCORd will be performed by Sarah Marchand, Anand Rajaram and Mahsa Ershadifar. Directed by: Jonathan Shaboo.

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Jax Smith is a writer, director, and illustrator. She co-created the branded content series, TURNING THE TABLES for Shaftesbury Films Inc., and her series DEFECT was shortlisted for the CFC's Netflix Project Development Accelerator. Jax directed and co-wrote the short film MENTAL. A BravoFACT recipient, it received five Leo nominations, including Best short drama and Best screenwriting. It garnered Jax the WIFTV Spotlight Image Award for 'an outstanding short work that shows production excellence or a unique, visionary approach.' Jax also directed THE STAKEOUT, nominated for an EDA award for 'Best Female-Directed Short' at the Whistler Film Festival 2017. She's directed projects for First Star and the World Wildlife Fund, which have screened on CBS, The Knowledge Network, and Urban Rush TV.

Jax is also a published illustrator (Simon & Schuster) and works as a story editor and creative consultant for JBA (Jeb Beach & Associates).
